Brief introduction

You may choose to focus on one or multiple prompts to guide you, but keep in mind there's a 10 minute time limit on the audio you submit.

Prompts

- What is it like to be a Black student at UF?
- Using your personal experience as a guide, how would you recommend or discourage a fellow Black student to attend UF and why?
- Describe an interaction with a course instructor, a faculty member, staff, or another student, in which you perceived your race was a factor in the outcome, be it negative or positive.
- Tell us a time on campus where you felt uncomfortable being a Black student at UF
- Tell us a time on campus where you felt a sense of pride and belonging about being a Black student at UF.
